The Selby City Council met in regular session on Wednesday, July 7, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Jeffrey Kosters called the meeting to order. WATERLINE REPLACEMENT PROJECTS

Phase 2 has begun replacing main lines. The contractor who is replacing water meters has just begun this week.

SEWER RATES

To be considered for any grant applications, the city must meet a minimum rate set by the state. Councilman Niemiller, head of Water and Sewer committee, proposed raising residential sewer rate to \$17.00. The past city ordinances have an additional charge of \$1.00 per additional household on a water meter as defined as apartment, hotel or motel room with a maximum of \$40.00 Niemiller conferred with the city attorney and suggested no maximum be stated. Therefore, Councilperson Niemiller introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION 2010-03

RESOLUTIONTO SET WATER, SEWER AND GARBAGE RATES

WHEREAS the current sewer rates are not sufficient to qualify for assistance with future projects with the

sewer in the City of Selby

THEREFORE be it resolved by the Selby City Council for Selby, South Dakota, to set water and sewer rates for all residential and commercial users; and garbage rates for all residential users as follows:

Water User Fee - \$19.00 + 2.75 per 1,000 gallons of water used

Residential and Commercial Sewer - \$ 17.00 + \$1.00 per month for sewer per additional household. A household is defined to include each apartment, hotel room or motel room used for lodging. For sewer hooked to any property outside the city limits the charge will be \$23.00 per month. For Good Samaritan Society, a non-profit organization, the rate will be \$23.00 per month.

Garbage - 11.00 per residential household

And be it further resolved that these water, sewer and garbage rates will go into effect August 31, 2010.

BUILDING PERMIT

Building permits were reviewed.

POLICE REPORT

Police chief Tonstad presented his written report for the month of June. The old police car is being prepared to declare surplus. Chief Tonstad asked if the light bar should be removed for another department. Motion by Schilling, second by Niemiller to declare the lightbar surplus and allow the Walworth County Sherriff's department to purchase it.

SUPT. REPORT

Supt. Eisemann presented his report for June. He will be assisting when possible with the meter replacement part of the project. Dutch elm is detected on city and private property. An official will be checking in the city next week. Eisemann is certified for pest control and will look into using a fogger for mosquitoes. Tony Weinzirl will assist with removal of trees. Cement valley gutters were discussed as the solution at several intersections for proper drainage.

GRASS TOTES

The grass totes are all spoken for. If anyone else wants a tote, the city will collect names to see when we will order another shipment.

RODEO

Doug Rueb representing Selby Area rodeo was present to answer any questions. It was suggested that horses be kept off the football practice field again. Rueb asked about spraying for mosquitoes.

COMMUNITY ACCESS GRANT

The city would like to again apply for a community access grant for North Railway since the project was not awarded the grant money in 2010. The specified blocks may be able to be changed yet. Mayor Kosters will consult with the engineer and NECOG about the application. Councilman Bohle moved, second by Baumann, for adoption for the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2010-04 RESOLUTION OF FINANCIAL COMMITMENT, RESPONSIBILITY FOR ROAD MAINTENANCE, AND SUPPORT FOR PROJECT

WHEREAS, the City of Selby is applying for a Community Access Grant through the South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) for the City of Selby, and

WHEREAS, the SDDOT requires a 40 percent local match for the construction costs of a project up to a specified amount; and

WHEREAS, the SDDOT required the local government agency to be responsible for the maintenance of improved road; and

WHEREAS, the City of Selby is in full support of this project and grant application;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Selby will provide the local match needed to supplement the SDDOT grant. This match will be 40 percent of the construction costs as shown in the grant application.

THEREFORE, BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the City of Selby will be responsible for maintenance of the improved road; and

THEREFORE, BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the City of Selby expresses their full support and cooperation to the road improvement project and the SDDOT CAG application.
